#### **Attendance**

Mullion School is a 'High Attendance' school. We know that children make better progress in their learning and education when they are in school on every possible occasion. We work closely in partnership with parents to ensure that every child is in school every day, and only absent when it is absolutely necessary. We know that gaps in learning, and missing out on being with friends are disruptive to educational and social progress. Where students are unwell and unable to attend school, parents must inform us as soon as possible by phoning our Attendance Officer, Mrs Roberts, on 01326 240098 Option 3, please leave a message. Alternatively, please email <a href="mailto:attendance@mullion.tpacademytrust.org">attendance@mullion.tpacademytrust.org</a>.

We continue to review our attendance procedures to ensure every child is supported to be in school whenever possible.

We do not authorise term time absence for any activity which could reasonably be arranged to take place outside of school time. This includes routine medical and dental appointments, family events and holidays. We will only authorise term time absence where the reasons are genuinely exceptional and where the activity cannot happen during a school holiday period.

Parents with any questions about attendance, or who would like to discuss support for their child, should contact their child's Head of Year or Mrs Roberts for advice.

#### **Pastoral Care and Support Team**

#### **Tutor groups**

Each pupil at Mullion School is under the care of a Tutor who will help and guide them, and who is responsible for their welfare and progress. Pupils are placed into a Tutor Group after consultation with the primary school. We try to ensure that all pupils know at least one other child in the tutor group, and that tutor groups are well balanced. All tutor groups meet in the morning to register attendance, to deal with school news and notices and to celebrate achievements. Tutors also provide our 'first line' support for any queries or difficulties. Wherever possible pupils stay with their tutor throughout their time with us.

#### The Tutor

Our Tutors are at the centre of our support and welfare programme. Tutors are in regular contact with parents and this partnership is very important. Please use the Tutor as a 'first port of call' for any questions or for advice or support.

#### **Our Pastoral Team**

The overall responsibility for coordinating the support for welfare and academic progress is led by our Heads of Year. Soon after joining the school every child is given an opportunity to talk about how they are getting on. Pastoral care is an on-going process: for this reason, our Year Leaders have time when they can meet pupils to discuss any issues or problems, for example with school work or friendships. Heads of Year also support option choices, examination entries and career aspirations including when pupils progress from us to Post 16 education at the end of Year 11.

#### **Progress Reviews and Reports to Parents**

Regular reviews of pupils' progress are an essential aspect of our partnership with parents. The most formal of these reviews is the annual report, which summarises pupils' efforts and achievements during the year. We also regularly provide Progress Reviews where we share information with parents on progress, effort, behaviour and attendance.

#### **Additional Support**

If a pupil's school work, homework, behaviour, punctuality or attitude are a cause for concern, a pupil may be placed on a 'target card'. This provides additional support and supervision. Please see our Behaviour Policy for more details.

The key purpose of our pastoral care is to provide support, encouragement and motivation to all pupils in Mullion School. Essential to our successful pastoral care system, is our partnership between parents and teachers. We recognise the all-important part played by parents in their child's education and we encourage parents to contact Mullion School whenever there are any questions or concerns.

#### **Our House System**

All students become a member of a 'House'. We have four Houses: Budoc, Gerent, Ricat and Yestin. Our House names have an historic connection to our Cornish heritage. Our House System creates a 'family' within the school which students take pride in supporting. School Houses are also an important part of our work to recognise and praise positive contribution, leadership and teamwork.

#### Lockers

All students in Year 7 are able to have an allocated locker. There is a small one off cost of £4.00 for the use of a locker. Pupils will be able to use the same locker throughout their first at Mullion School, until they finish Year 7 when the key will need to be returned. During their first week we will show them where their locker is. Lockers are used to store books, PE kits and coats during the day.

#### **Equipment**

All students need to bring:

- A suitable school bag to carry books, packed lunch etc.
- A water bottle
- Their iPAD
- Writing pens, pencil, eraser, ruler
- A calculator

Please do not bring Tippex or other correcting fluid.

#### **Mobile Phones**

Students are allowed to bring a mobile phone to school. Phones must be switched off and kept in students' bags throughout the day. We do not permit students to use their phones in school and this applies to both lesson time and social time. This is because the use of phones during lessons is a distraction and interrupts learning. It also avoids any safeguarding issues that may otherwise arise with unsupervised use of phones at social times.

Parents are asked not to contact their child during the school day on their mobile phone. This is to avoid students being tempted to check their phones. In an emergency, parents should phone our Receptionist and we will ensure that messages are passed on to students.

Please be aware that if a student is seen to be using a mobile phone in school we will confiscate the phone and it will be held in Reception and a parent/carer will be able to collect it at the end of the day. We are very grateful to parents for their support for our approach to managing mobile phones in schools.

#### Homework

We believe that homework is an important part of education. By regularly doing homework, our students learn important skills: independent study, how to learn and memorise key information in preparation for tests, and about organising work and meeting deadlines. We gradually develop these skills over the time that students are with us, so that they are well prepared for the exams taken in Year 11 and the next stages of their education beyond Mullion School.

We ensure that the amount of homework children are set is reasonable, and allows time for them to relax, socialise, and pursue other interests outside of school. We also ensure that all homework activities are meaningful and connected to the curriculum that students are learning in their lessons.

Homework gradually increases in length and complexity as our students progress from Year 7 to Year 11.

Teachers set homework in lessons and make sure students understand what has been set and what needs to be done. Every student is provided with a Planner so they can record what work has been set, and when it must be completed by. Homework is also set online using Classcharts which both parents and students have access to. Parents can therefore keep an eye on the work that has been set and can see what the deadlines are for completing it.

In Year 7, homework activities would typically take around 30 minutes to complete and we try not to set homework which would take much longer than this.

#### Uniform

At Mullion School, our uniform is designed to be comfortable, practical, durable, and excellent value for money—while also ensuring students look smart and feel part of our school community.

#### This year, we've simplified our uniform to just three core items:

- A light blue polo shirt with the school logo
- · A navy blue crew neck sweatshirt
- A blue unisex sports top

We are committed to offering the best value smart uniform possible. To support this, we ask that all other clothing items be plain black and meet the requirements outlined below.

All uniform items can be purchased online from Price and Buckland. We also keep sample sizes in school—please contact the school office during term time if you'd like to try them on. A sizing guide is available on our school website.

#### Compulsory Items:

- Light blue polo shirt with the school logo (Prefects wear a red polo shirt)
- Navy blue school sweatshirt
  - In cooler weather, students should wear both the polo shirt and sweatshirt.
  - In warmer weather, the polo shirt may be worn on its own.
  - Undergarments (e.g. vests or t-shirts) must not be visible.
- Completely black footwear
  - Heel height under 5cm
  - No logos, coloured laces, or decorative flashes
  - No boots above the ankle
  - Polishable shoes are preferred
  - Plain black trainer-style shoes are acceptable

#### Optional (Choose One):

- Formal black school trousers
  - (No elasticated fabric, leggings, joggers, denim, contrast stitching, studs, skinny jeans, or combat trousers)
- Formal tailored black shorts (knee length)
- Formal black school skirt (knee length)
   (No elasticated or tube-style skirts)

#### **Socks and Tights:**

- Black or white socks, or black tights (no rips or holes)
- If socks are worn over tights, they must be black

#### Hair styles and make-up

No extravagant hair styles or colours. Discreet hair slides, hair bands and grips are permitted.

Pupils in Year 7, 8 and 9 must not wear make-up. Pupils in Year 10 and 11 are permitted to wear discreet make-up.

#### **Jewellery**

1 watch and 1 plain ring are permitted. 'Smart' watches are not allowed. Students may wear 1 stud earring in either one or both ears. Studs must be smaller than the ear lobe and discreet. Hooped earrings are not permitted. Students may wear a single stud in the nose. Nose rings, hoops and any other body piercing including eyebrow and tongue piercings are not permitted. Neck jewellery and braceletsmust not be visible. All jewellery must be able to be removed on request e.g. for PE lessons.

#### IMPORTANT FOR ALL

All students are expected to wear our Mullion School Uniform correctly, every day. Occasionally, we accept that events may mean there is a genuine reason that a child may be unable to wear the correct uniform for a short and temporary period of time. Parents must provide a note for any occasion when a child is unable to wear the correct uniform.

Football/rugby boots and shin pads when required

#### 1 HEIGHT

Without shoes, with the back against the wall place feet together flat on the floor. Measure from the top of the head to the ground.

#### 2 NECK

Measure around the base of the neck where the shirt collar would normally sit. Leave a little room for comfort.

#### 3 CHEST

Measure the chest at the fullest part placing the tape close up under the arms

#### 4 WAIST

Measure around the natural waistline, at the narrowest part. Leave a little extra room for comfort.

#### 5 HIPS

Standing straight, with heels together, measure around the fullest part.

#### 6 INSIDE LEG

In bare feet take the measurement from the top of the inside leg to the floor.

#### **Transport (Student Travel)**

Cornwall Council provide transport for all pupils living more than three miles from the school except where the pupil lives in the catchment area of another school and is attending Mullion School as a matter of choice. The distance is measured from the home to the school by the nearest available walking route.

Children from beyond the catchment area and pupils living *within* three miles of Mullion School may be able to travel on existing contract vehicles, where there is room, as concessionary riders for a charge. The availability of concessionary seats cannot be guaranteed for the future. Out-of-area parents must make their own arrangements for transport.

Pupils make their own way to and from home to the designated drop-off/collection points for school buses.

Details of the routes, timing and stopping places of contract buses will be sent to parents by Cornwall Council Student Travel.

If a contract bus is late in arriving at the pick-up point, pupils should not attempt to walk to school or home. A relief bus will be sent. Pupils should wait at their bus's pick-up point for up to **20 minutes**. If after 20 minutes no bus has arrived, pupils should walk home and phone the school. If the bus breaks down during the journey, pupils should remain on the bus until a relief vehicle arrives. The school is always informed immediately of any breakdown; parents with any concerns about a delay in bus arrival, please telephone our Reception.

The journey to and from school is part of our school day. Pupils continue to represent the school on this journey and pupils must maintain a good standard of behaviour. Cornwall Council has a Code of Conduct which is given to all pupils and parents.

Bus passes are posted to parents by Cornwall Council before the start of the school year. In the event that a pupil does not receive their bus pass, please contact the Passenger Transport Unit at County Hall as follows:

#### Transport by car

For pupils travelling by car, please note our school carpark is closed between 2.45-3.30pm, to avoid additional congestion at a particularly busy time of the day. In the mornings, for safety, please drop pupils outside the school and not enter the school car park. In the afternoons, parents should either:

- Park on the road if there is a safe place to do so or
- Delay your collection until after 3.30pm.

For the safety of our students, the school car park has a maximum speed limit of <u>5 miles per hour at all times.</u>

#### **School Meals**

We provide a catering service for breakfast, break and lunch. All meals are freshly prepared on site.

#### **Our Dining Rooms**

We have two separate dining rooms. Hot food is served in C3. Cold food, pasties and pre-orders are served in C1. Any students who attend a club can pre-order their meals and can collect them at 1.15pm if they wish. Pre orders may be made at break or breakfast times.

Our dining rooms are busy and Year 7 pupils leave lessons slightly earlier for the first 2 weeks of term to help them settle into the routines.

#### **Payment**

The canteen is cashless. Parents put money into their child's account via Parent Pay. Pupils use a thumb print to pay for food. All items are clearly priced. The cost of a school lunch depends on the food selected. Our system allows parents to monitor what their child is spending.

#### Free School Meals

Application forms can be completed online via the Cornwall Council website and forms are also available from the School Office. Once completed, parents should return the form to Cornwall Council (please see address below). Parents will be advised if their child is eligible. Children with FSM entitlement use our cashless 'thumb print' system to 'pay' for their lunch.
